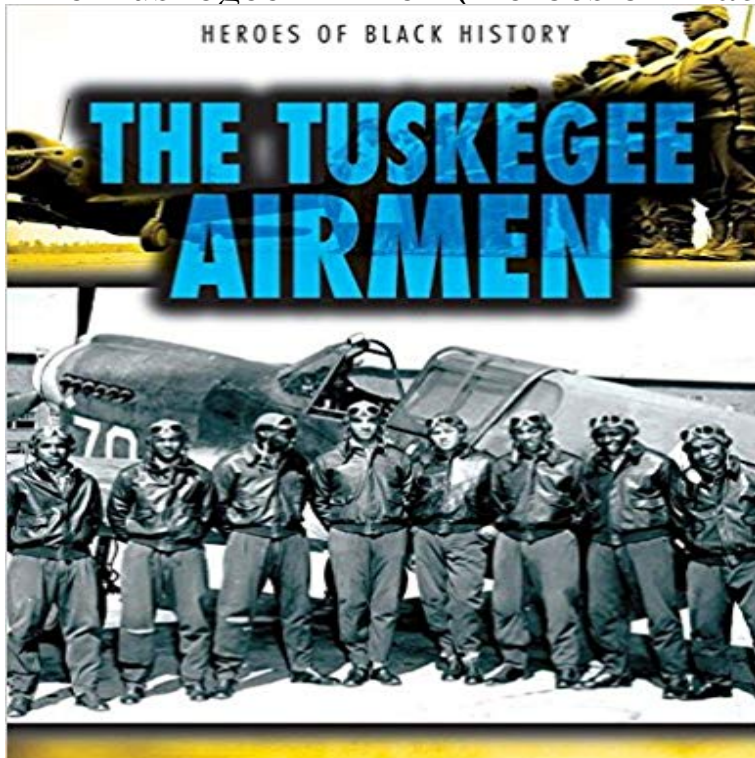


The Tuskegee Airmen (Heroes of Black History)
