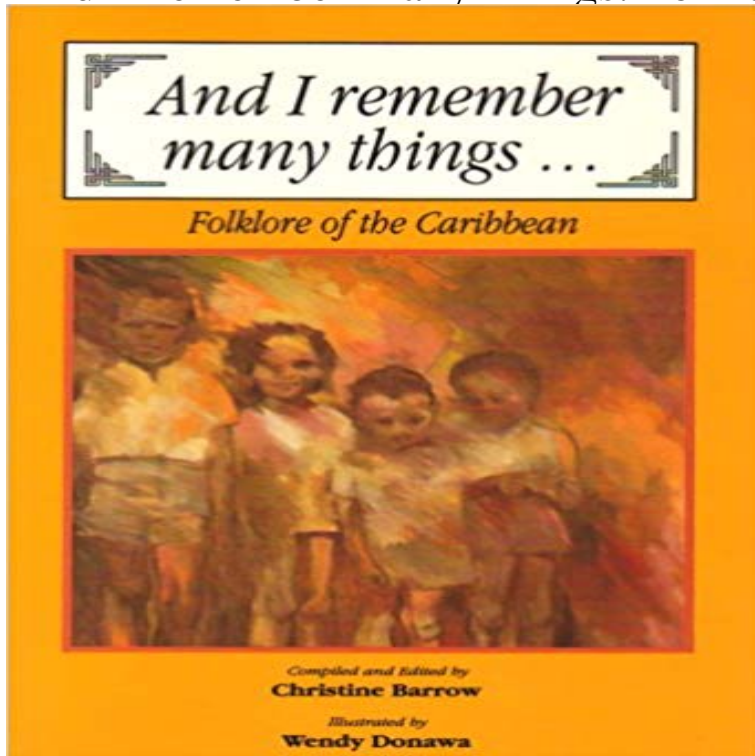


And I Remember Many Things: Folklore of the Caribbean
