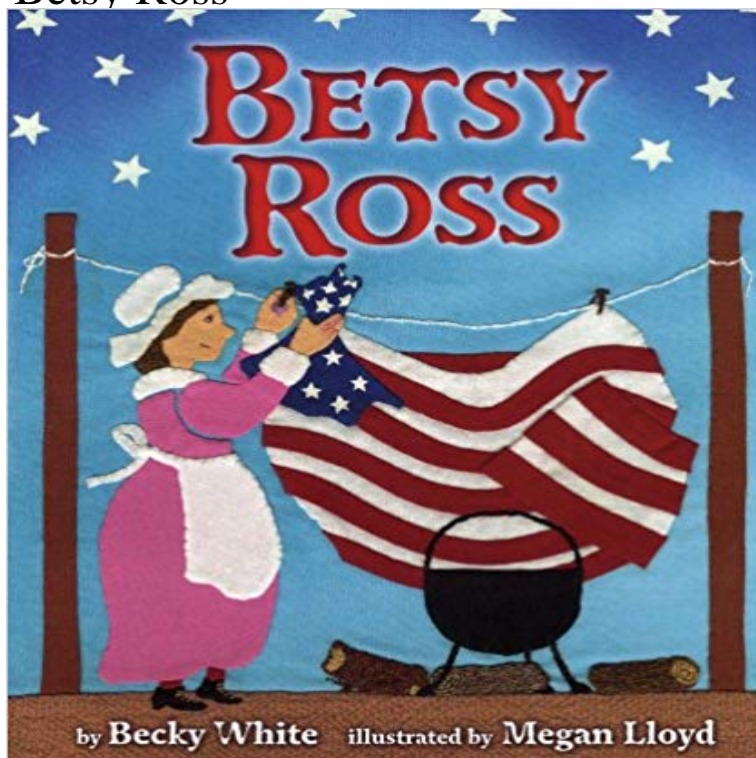


## Betsy Ross
