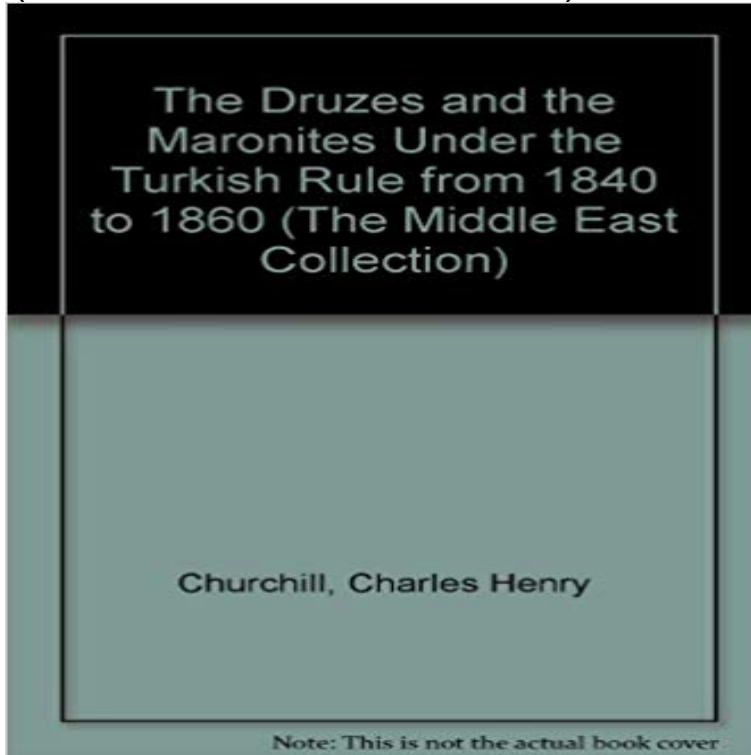


The Druzes and the Maronites Under the Turkish Rule from 1840 to 1860 (The Middle East Collection)

Not illustrated. 1862 Excerpt: ...in the village of Baabda and Hadet, the residence of the Shehab emirs, an hours distance from Beyrout, sent a body of three hundred men to protect them. These passed within gunshot of the camp, without the slightest molestation. On the 29th, however, the pasha sent emissaries to the emirs, calling upon them to send back the reinforcements they had received, and assuring them solemnly of his protection from any attack on the part of the Druzes: a protection which from his vicinity to them he could the more readily afford. His orders were immediately obeyed. The reinforcements withdrew; but most of the male inhabitants having little confidence in such assurances withdrew also. Their presentiments were too fully verified. On the morning of the 30th of May, the Druzes, by a preconcerted understanding with the **PLUNDER BY TURKISH SOLDIERS**. 145 Turks, and even acting by signal, descended from the heights immediately over the above mentioned, and now abandoned villages, and commenced a furious onslaught. Meeting of course with little or no resistance, their raid was quickly accomplished. In less than three hours, the villages were in flames. The Christians, men, women, and children, fled in the utmost consternation. One hundred Turkish soldiers had been previously placed in such a position as to support the Druzes, in case, by any chance, of a reverse, and these now joined the latter in following up the fugitives. The Turkish irregular cavalry also joined vigorously in the pursuit, cutting down every Christian they overtook, and robbing and plundering the women whom the Druzes had left unmolested. The Turks began the work of

incendiarism long before the Druzes arrived. The latter were pushing their way on to Beyrout itself, but three discharges of cannon from the ...
