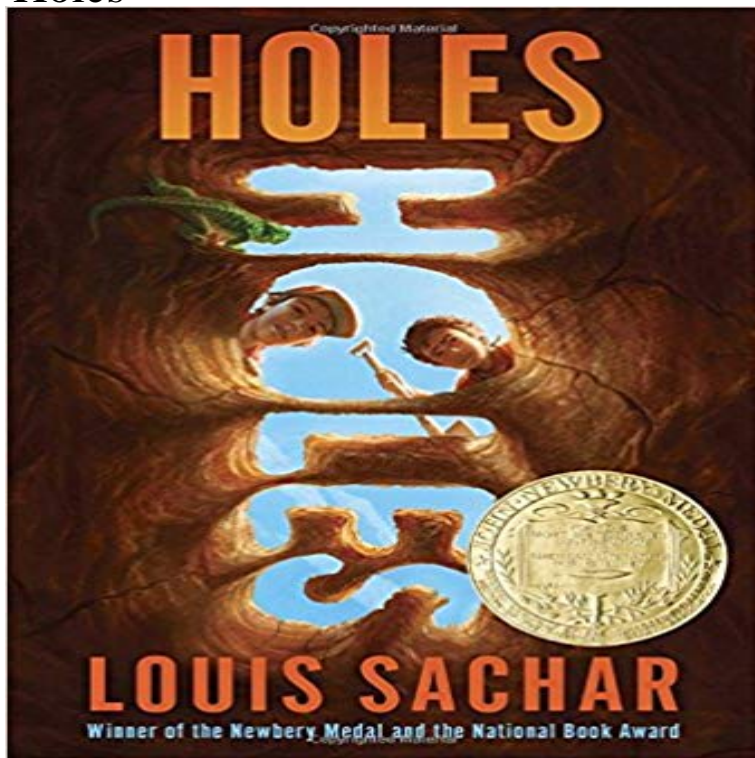


Holes
