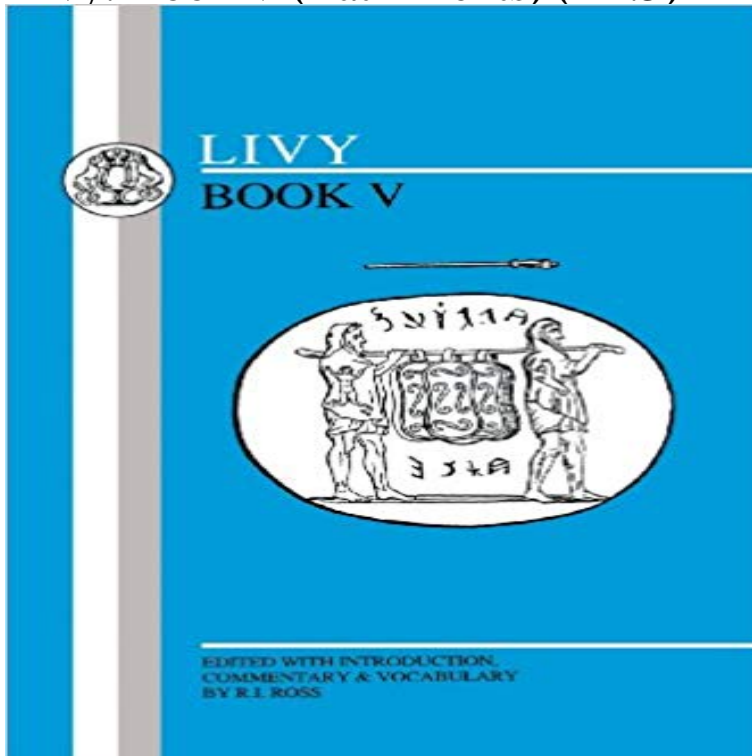


Livy: Book V (Latin Texts) (Bk.5)
