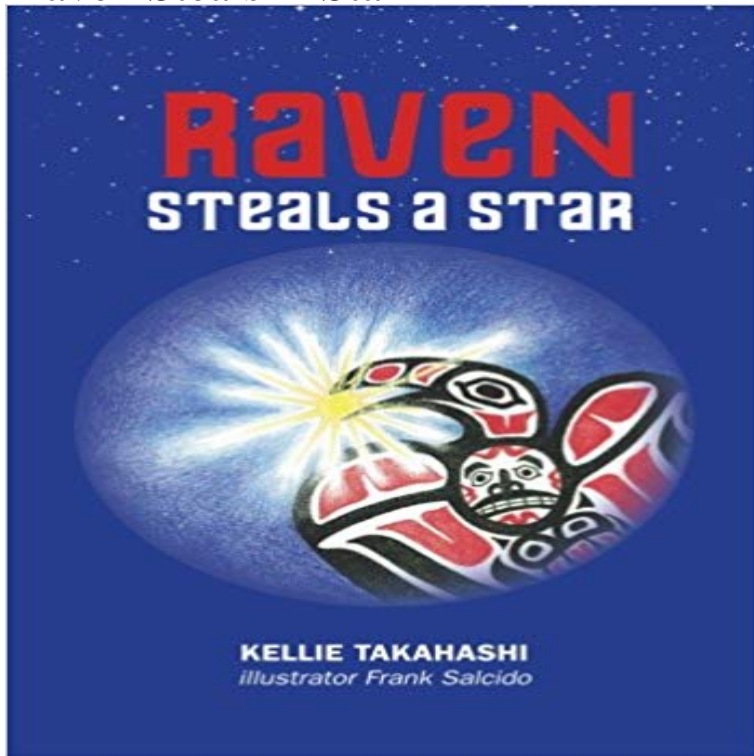


Raven Steals A Star
