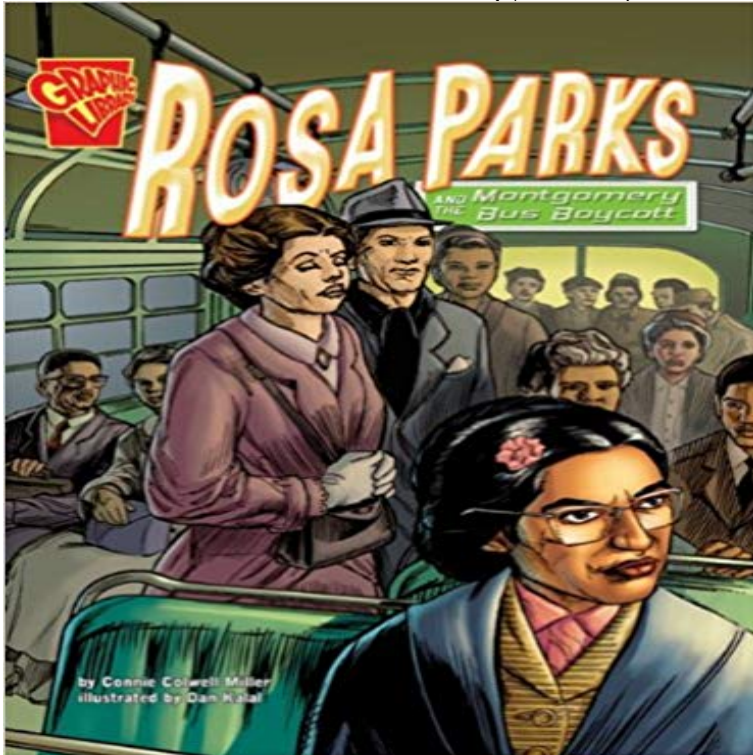


## Rosa Parks and the Montgomery Bus Boycott
