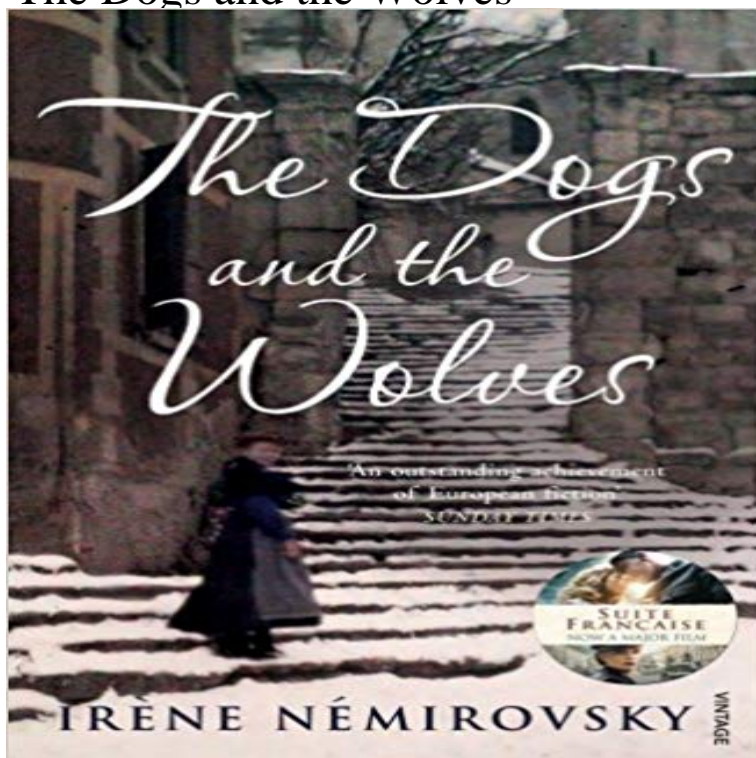


The Dogs and the Wolves
